For the past few years there has been a leak above our organ pipes. James Konzelman, our organ builder/repairer for lo, these many years, and Paul Sanner rigged a tarp over the pipes to protect them. That was about the best they could do until building rights and ownership responsibilities had been sorted out.

It happened that the section of the roof that was leaking is owned by Argo, Inc. They agreed to have a "quick fix" done by our contractor, Two Tone, at their expense, and it was accomplished – before the snow storm, WHEW! Argo has further agreed to do a permanent fix, at their expense, and to pay SPC for the damage to the organ for which they are responsible. All's well that ends well.

You also may have noticed the new electrical wall switches in the narthex – a great aesthetic and safety improvement.

Weather has stalled our hopes to begin to finish masonry work on the church façade, but spring will come and we will address it with alacrity.

Also planned for the summer is the long-awaited electrical upgrade! We are making progress.
