From the Pastor

Well, dear new friends, I'm here! And though I've met many of you, I'm eager to get to know all of you better. That will happen in time, I know – but meanwhile, please don't be shy about reaching out if you'd like to get together for a cup of coffee or a walk or just a phone chat.

Since there are some changes taking place – and there will be more – I want to use this space in the next two months, at least, to talk about some new or different (or, perhaps, revived) elements in the worship service; and about upcoming steps in the interim period.

A Word About Worship: The Prayer for Illumination

I hope you've noticed that now, before we hear the Scripture readings and sermon – before that is, hearing the Word of God read and proclaimed – we offer a prayer asking God to send the Holy Spirit to help open our ears to hear and our hearts to receive what God is saying to us through Scripture and interpretation. According to our denominational Directory for Worship (W-3.0302): "This sense of utter reliance on the illumination of the Spirit is an important and distinctive mark of the Reformed tradition. The prayer for illumination precedes the reading of Scripture and preaching of the sermon and applies to all of the readings, as well as the proclamation [preaching] of the Word."

Please note: a common error (even among pastors!) is to call this The Prayer *of* Illumination, rather than The Prayer *for* Illumination. Prayer "of" implies that the mere fact of praying illumines our minds and hearts. Prayer "for" rightly acknowledges that we seek God's help.

One more thing: The Directory for Worship is part of our Book of Order,

which is in turn part of the Constitution of the denomination to which we belong, The Presbyterian Church (USA). The Book of Order is Part II of the constitution; Part I is our Book of Confessions, which contains the ancient and contemporary "confessions," or, affirmations, of our Reformed Christian faith.

Interim - But Not, We Pray, Interminable!

This month, I simply want to give you a brief overview of the process of calling a new installed pastor (based upon *The Revised On Calling a Pastor* guide, available at the PC (USA) website at http://oga.pcusa.org/section/mid-council-ministries/clc/revised-calling-pastor/). Please note: I said overview, not timeline, as God alone knows how long each step will take; and, notice the acronyms – you'll be seeing them a lot in the next year or so!

Interim Pastor arrives --- Mission Study Review process begins, involving survey questionnaires and in-person meetings with church and community members, review of the congregation's financial capability, etc --- completed Mission Study goes to COM (Committee on Ministry, Presbytery of NYC) --- COM approves Mission Study and authorizes the church to elect a PNC (Pastor Nominating Committee) --- the Session calls a congregational meeting to elect PNC --- PNC elected and begins work --- PNC writes the MIF (Ministry Information Form: like an in-depth job description/want ad for the pastor position) --- COM approves MIF --- PNC submits to the CLC (Church Leadership Connection website) --- PNC defines search/interview process; begins reviewing PIFS (Personal Information Forms – a pastor's "resume") --- PNC interviews --- Presbytery conducts reference checks --- PNC chooses a nominee and extends a call --- PNC and pastor candidate negotiate terms of call --- COM approves call --- Session authorizes a congregational meeting to elect --- Pastor Nominee preaches at worship --- immediately after worship, congregation meets to elect (God willing!) your new pastor!!!
