## New Faces at Second Presbyterian Church

### **Kyunghee “Katy” Kim, Choir Section Leader**

Many of you have already met (and heard!) our new soprano section leader and soloist, Ms. Kyunghee Kim. Kyunghee (who also goes by “Katy”) received her Bachelor’s degree from Seoul National University and her Master’s degree in Voice from the Manhattan School of Music. Married and the mother of three children, Kyunghee lives in Nyack, New York and loves to go hiking near Bear Mountain Park and to travel around the world to meet new people and experience new cultures. Along with baritone soloist and section leader Liang Zhao, Katy is a blessing to our SPC Choir and our wonderful music program, so skillfully led by Eunjung Ahn. We are thrilled that Kyunghee has chosen to share her considerable gifts and bright spirit with our congregation.



### **Keion M. Jackson, Sunday School Teacher**

Our new Sunday School teacher is Mr. Keion Jackson – Mr. K, to our children. Keion is a graduate of Arts High School (NJ), where he studied Classical Voice and Choral Conducting. A third-year student at New Jersey City University, majoring in Sociology and African American Studies, Keion holds several distinguished positions at NJCU: Associate Vice President of the Black Student Union, Student Chair of the university’s Senate Committee of Curriculum and Instruction, and Associate Campus Minister for Student Engagement. In addition, Keion has written articles on African American life, published by the New Jersey City University Press and several social justice magazines.



In 2018, Keion received a certificate of Christian Ministry from New York Theological Seminary and is an Ordained Minister through the United Church, as well as a board-certified chaplain. He has done internships with the Episcopal Diocese of Newark, Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, and Eastminster Presbyterian Church of Pittsburgh. Keion previously served as Christian Education Director at two churches and as music director for three churches before accepting the job as Sunday School Teacher at Second Presbyterian. It is Keion’s goal to receive a Masters of Divinity, and a Doctorate of Philosophy in African American Studies and Sociology from Yale University. He is also discerning a call to ordination to the office of Minister of Word and Sacrament in the PC(USA). Keion will be a great asset to SPC as he nurtures the faith of our children – and what a privilege that we get to be part of his spiritual journey!

### **Rev. Alex Awad Joins Us for World Communion Sunday**

World Communion Sunday (October 7, 2018) is always a special day at SPC, as we worship at 11 am with our partners in ministry, the Chinese Community Church, and share a fellowship meal afterwards. This year, we are delighted that our special guest preacher will be the Rev. Alex Awad, who is serving as a 2018 PC(USA) International Peacemaker. Rev. Awad served as Dean of Students and full-time instructor at Bethlehem Bible College in Bethlehem where he was on the faculty for 24 years. He is a charter member of the college’s Board of Directors and served since 1994 as senior pastor at East Jerusalem Baptist Church. He

is a past board member of the Evangelical Local Council of Churches in the Holy Land, and directed the Shepherd Society, Bethlehem Bible College’s charitable ministry. Alex and his wife Brenda have moved to the Pacific Northwest to be closer to their children.
