**Sunday, July 7, 10:15 am:** During this worship service so close to the July Fourth holiday, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Communion and sing the lovely patriotic hymn, "O Beautiful, For Spacious Skies," with its timely prayer that God will mend our nation's every flaw. Scripture: Galatians 6: 1-16, Luke 10: 1-20. Sermon: "Road Trip."

### **MISSION STUDY - YOU'RE INVITED!**

The next stage of our mission review is upon us! Beginning this month and continuing into the fall, we will engage in surveys, meetings and collaborations to help evaluate the direction of the church – a required step before we elect a Pastor Nominating Committee.

The idea is that to discern where God might want us to go, we want to define who we are now. The mission study team, with the support of the Session, has identified three areas to help us get there.

The first step will be a survey to be completed by members, friends and visitors about

experiences in worship and the life of the church. We will begin the process **during worship on July 14** when, instead of hearing a sermon, we will fill out surveys. All other elements of the worship service will remain. Those unable to attend worship on July 14 can fill out the survey online or on paper. All answers are anonymous, but you do need to report that you have taken the survey.

Second, we will explore and reflect on the neighborhood around the church, with the help of someone who specializes in examining church-neighborhood relationships – the Rev. Phil Tom, a member of New York City Presbytery. A meeting with Rev. Tom, to talk about how we might explore our neighborhood and its needs, will take place on **Wednesday, August 7** at 6:30 – 8 pm (room TBA). Everyone is invited to attend and get involved. Those who have lived in the neighborhood might be helpful in providing insights on the changes in the neighborhood over the years as well as the relationship over time between the church and the community.

After the surveys are compiled, we will share the results with the congregation and hold a series of conversations to help us define our common values and how to move forward into the future. We hope this stage can begin in September.

The last stage of the process involves writing a report defining our mission and the results of our study. The Mission Study Report is then submitted to the Presbytery's Commission on Ministry. Once it is approved, we can move to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee.

If you would like to serve at any or all of these stages, please contact Rev. Lindsay. You can choose one discrete area to help with or help lead the entire effort. All contributions are welcome and appreciated.
