



SAVE THE DATE

VOTE! Absentee Application Deadlines:

For the June 23 Primary, absentee applications received by email, fax or telephone, the deadline is close-of-business on June 16th. Absentee applications received by postal mail with a postmark on or before June 16th must be processed.

After June 16th, voters may apply in person (over-the-counter) through June 22nd or by Early Voting from June 13-21. Please check with your local board of elections for Early Voting hours and locations. The deadline for the postmarked return of an absentee ballot has been extended to June 23, 2020 for the primary election and November 3, 2020 for the general election per Chapter 91 of the laws of 2020.


