Dear Friends in Christ,

A word about returning to in-person worship on October 17.

Almost two-thirds of survey respondents told us they are ready to give in-person worship a try, so we are planning our "trial run" in-person service for October 17 – with an option to watch the livestream of the service. More details, and a link to the livestream, will be sent out as we get closer.

But here are some things you might like to know:

You will be asked to sign in, so that we can contact trace if necessary.

You will be asked, optionally, to check a box saying whether or not you've been vaccinated.

Masks and social distancing will be required at all times in the sanctuary.

There will be no congregational singing (you can hum along with the soloist under your breath and under your mask!).

The service will start with the prelude at a few minutes before 10:15, and will end by 11:00.

There will be no Sunday School on this day.

There will be no fellowship hour – and you'll be asked to exit promptly after the service. We'll pray it's not too cold, and you'll be able to say hello to friends on the sidewalk – though not right in front of the church doors.

I know that seems like a lot of "No"s! But we want to keep everyone safe and comfortable, so please bear with us. Then we'll see how it goes on October 17. If all is well, we'll try again on another Sunday in November.

And we will, of course, continue to follow the guidance of the presbytery, the city and the CDC, and will let you know ASAP if anything changes. We have come this far by faith, and we will continue to be led by all the wisdom God sends to us!

## **Supporting Reproductive Justice**

Members of the Anti-Racism Group will attend the march and rally for Reproductive Rights on October 2, sponsored by Women's March, Planned Parenthood, and other groups across the nation. There will be rallies in every state.

This is a sensitive issue in the church but, as the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) 217<sup>th</sup> General Assembly said in 2006: "When an individual woman faces the decision whether to terminate a pregnancy, the issue is intensely personal, and may manifest itself in ways that do not reflect public rhetoric, or do not fit neatly into medical, legal or policy guidelines. Humans are empowered by the spirit prayerfully to make significant moral choices, including the choice to continue or end a pregnancy. Human choices should not be made in a moral vacuum, but must be based on Scripture, faith and Christian ethics. For any choice, we are accountable to God; however, even when we err, God offers to forgive us."

We'll let you know how the march goes, and about other opportunities to stand up for justice.
